Memories

Jesse worked in the masonry trade as a cement finisher for over 50 years and he taught his family the value of hard work and perseverance. He took great pride in the home he built, always kept his yard well groomed, and completed many home improvement projects using his master masonry skills and his creative eye.

He was good natured and very well known throughout the community. Jesse was always willing to help anyone in need and he did not look for rewards because as he often testified, his rewards came from God’s grace and mercy. He loved to laugh, joke, and spend time with family and friends. He was great at playing cards, dominos, checkers, and horseshoes, and enjoyed watching Westerns especially those with his favorite actor Clint Eastwood.

His commitment to Shiloh Old Site Baptist Church began in 1949, when he helped build the church. He joined Shiloh in 1951, became a Deacon in 1954 and a Trustee in 1961. After serving many years in the Deacon Ministry, Jesse became the Chairman of Deacons and the Church Treasurer in 1983, and he served Shiloh Old Site Baptist Church faithfully in this capacity for over 30 years.
