A Life Well Lived!

Hettie Raines Robinson was born on October 25, 1919 at Saint Agnes Hospital, adjacent to the campus of Saint Augustine's University. Hettie's wish was to live to be 100; she didn't quite make it, passing at the age of 98. Hettie was born to the late Exie Lillian and Arthur Buxton Raines. She departed this earthly life and entered the 'Master's Joy' on April 3, 2018. Along with her parents and husband, Hettie was preceded in death by her five siblings, Ethel Raines, William Raines, James Raines, Colden Raines, and Dorothy Raines.

Hettie attended elementary school in Apex, North Carolina until second grade, and at the end of the school year, her family moved to Raleigh. She excelled in her studies in the Raleigh School System. Hettie loved living on Lenoir Street in East Raleigh where she spent time playing at Chavis Park, attending and graduating from Washington High School.

Hettie received a BS from Shaw University in 1943 and a Masters from Glassboro State in New Jersey. She met Dr. John Robinson while at Shaw, and they were united in holy matrimony for 57 years, at the time of his death.

Hettie was a member of Mt. Zion Baptist Church from birth, originally arriving in a horse drawn buggy as a child. She relocated to New Jersey after marriage and returned to Mt. Zion after retiring. Hettie faithfully attended until failing health no longer allowed her participation.

Hettie spent her life as an educator for over forty years. She was employed as a Home Economics and Special Education teacher during that time.

Hettie's memberships include, lifelong member of the NAACP and Platinum Member of the North Carolina Links. Hettie joined the Atlantic City, New Jersey Links in 1960, where she served two non consecutive years as President. After retiring she later joined the Raleigh Chapter of Links. Hettie loved gardening/farming, cooking and traveling. She was blessed to travel to many countries throughout Europe, Africa and the Caribbean.

Hettie leaves to mourn her passing and celebrate her home going; her only child, daughter, Cheryl Robinson; nieces, Yvonne Allen, Pamela Anderson (Leonardy), Sharon Graddy (Rudy), Patricia Fullilove (Harold); nephews, Earl Raines (Dionicia), Billy Raines, Romley Raines (Eliana), Colden Raines, Jr. (Silvia); sisters-in-law, Francis Raines and Katherine Raines; brother-in-law, Addison Hobbs; goddaughter, Natalie Moore, a host of cousins, other relatives and friends.
