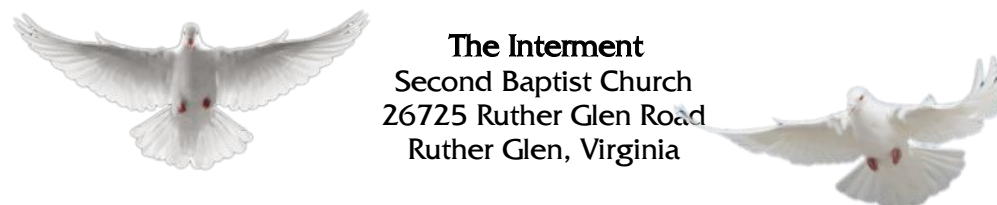

The Obituary
